The committee decided if what Senator Byars proposed, maybe we could even expand on it a little bit. So the committee amendment allows HHS to reimburse the cost of transportation to an individual providing transportation to an eligible person. I think Senator Byars' original bill was a nonbinding...nonlegal binding relative. expand that just a bit. And as he said, quite often, transportation is lacking in rural areas, even in urban areas. You have to call, get it arranged, and sometimes it's not too timely. But what we've done with the committee...the committee did is expand this just a bit. It says an individual is...this individual is under contract with the Nebraska Health and Human Services System and provides transportation to eligible person and the eligible person has chosen the individual to provide the transportation. So this eligible person isn't going to get stuck with someone. They have to actually approve this individual, and then that individual has to apply to HHS. individual, if accepted by HHS--and the department has the ability in the committee amendment to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations to implement this process--then that person can So any individual that meets these criteria, be reimbursed. they'll be under contract with HHS. They're actually chosen by individual to provide transportation. They can be reimbursed for their cost. As Senator Byars said, insurance is not a problem so long as they're reimbursed and not a for-hire
