February, the state of Tennessee has published news reports of that state's shortage, and the March 5 edition of the Lincoln Journal Star had a full-page report on the nursing shortage Perhaps you read it and saw the statistics. conclusion, LB 962 is my priority bill to fund a nursing faculty student loan forgiveness program. The bill asks for a one-time, repeat, a one-time appropriation of \$150,000 as seed money to show the state's commitment to expanding our nursing ranks. could give you many statistics about shortages and our aging population which would require more nursing care starting today. Our sparse population of 1.7 million is a factor in this shortage, the same as that affects many other bills that have been debated on this floor. It's my hope that others will see Nebraska's commitment to this loan program and be encouraged to join in the effort to further educate current nurses who wish to become nursing faculty.
