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person that understands the environment behind the scenes, I guess. Am I answering your question right? I mean...

SENATOR LOUDEN: Well, not really, because I'm getting at, is, you're putting the job of issuing a citation on some of your fire and health officials, whereas...and when you do that, then they're the ones that have to testify in court, my understanding. Whenever...whoever issues a citation, they can be the ones that can be asked to testify in court against a person that the citation was filed against. And that's what I'm wondering, if we're setting up some other level of government here, that was going to be a detriment to some of these smaller towns and villages that usually...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR LOUDEN: ...they...when they do give...have a problem like that, there's usually somebody in there already that they bring it up with code. I mean, the law is fulfilled already. I just was questioning why we had to have this new language in there, to go on with the smaller towns. Yeah, I'll give you the rest of my time, Senator Friend, if you wish it.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Friend.

SENATOR FRIEND: Thank you, Senator Louden. I think...and I don't know any other way to answer your question. I think I know where you're going here, but I could be wrong, and I've got my light pushed, and we can talk...I can talk further about that...about this provision. But what I would say is that right now, the only person...it's my understanding the only person could actually come in and issue the citation is the peace officer. So they're issuing a citation that they may not even be able to adequately address in that hearing. And my...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR FRIEND: Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Friend and Senator Louden. Senator Chambers.
