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in this Legislature. What happens in this Legislature is not an ego builder for me. It is work that I do because I agreed with the people in my district who voted for me that I would come down here and work every day.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would use my own judgment, and I would do what I do my way. Senator Friend is correct when he says that this--this wasn't his exact word--it's a battle. We're going to have a war of wills. We'll see who will fold. And wouldn't it make everybody happy to see me fold, just like it gave everybody a momentary feeling of pleasure when Senator Beutler announced that he's going to stand up to me. Well, let him, and I'm not going to fight dirty. I like Senator Beutler. But Senator Beutler is a young man, and sometimes youth will lead a person into conduct that is not wise. But wisdom comes through learning from experiences, and it's my job to help give those experiences that will result in wisdom. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion? Senator Friend, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR FRIEND: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. Senator Loudon, I wanted to finish...I did talk to Mr. Stadtwald a little bit, and I wanted to make sure I wasn't misleading you. I don't believe that I did, but I think I can give you an analogy. On page 4 of the bill, obviously is what you're talking about, subsection (2): If a city of the second class or village has adopted and is enforcing a fire, health, safety, or constructional technical code, the chief or head official in the fire department, fire inspectors designated by such chief or head official, on and on, and then it essentially says that they have to be trained by that peace officer, law enforcement official, as to how to issue those citations. The reasoning behind that is, I think, if there is a grease pit is full, or if there's electrical problems in a particular spot, that peace officer right now not only needs to be there to issue the citation, but also has to go with that fire code official to court to testify on what happened. That's taking time away from
