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He was working for Union Pacific at the time. That rule seems like it has Ernie. He said, he'll dominate more than ever before if they enact that rule. He said, I don't know how he's going to do it, but if I had to bet, my money would be on Ernie, because he knows I'm not like the rest of these senators here. I don't shoot blanks. I don't win everything.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Hello, Mr. Speaker. But I will do my job the way that I think I ought to do it, and you all are going to just stay here with me, whether you want to or not. And if I can figure out that you don't want to, that pleases me all the more. All I have to do, Senator Pahls, is be, simply be, and I upset so many white people that I do more for the cause of black people than maybe all the black people who lived before. I don't have to raise a hand against anybody. Simply be. To be or not to be; well, I shall not, not be. And Senator Beutler and I are going to continue our struggle, but Senator Beutler is kind of laying low right now. He's resting up, and in the latter stages, he's going to come out with what they call a kick, in track,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...or a flurry, in boxing. You said what?

SENATOR CUDABACK: I said time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Further discussion? Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: Mr. President, members. Senator Chambers, I'm showing my hands--and Senator Chambers is not listening--because Senator Chambers asked people to show their hands. Well, I haven't been participating in any little cabals. I haven't had any conversations about voting cloture on anything. I actually read through the bill and found some fairly interesting things that Senator Chambers may not remember. But there's the provision on individuals being able to issue citations, is very
