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SENATOR D. PEDERSON: ...a very significant difference was the TEEOSA school aid proposal, and that was remarkably different, and I...

SENATOR BROWN: That was \$17 million a year, to the favor...to the bottom line's favor.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes, yes. That favored us, and then we got hit pretty hard by Medicaid. I do have a breakdown now that's been handed to me of the major differences from the Governor and the General Funds, as proposed,...

SENATOR BROWN: Okay. Maybe we could...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: ...and they've just given me that, which is not a part of this.

SENATOR BROWN: Maybe we can follow up on that, because I'd like to talk about it a little bit more. I did have a question from one of the other members about the amount that we were looking at for aid to the university system for utility costs, but there's also an amount in there for utility costs for code agencies. Could you tell me what that number was that you guys used for...across-the-board for agencies?

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Time, Senator. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. Lieutenant Governor, members. Senator Pederson, would you yield to a question or two?

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Senator Pederson, would you yield?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I will.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you. I heard...you spoke on the budget earlier today, and then, of course, a few days ago, and I have a general concern about a 7.3 percent overall growth in our budget. But when I looked through this, the goldenrod copy, it seems to me about \$18 million is in what I would call extra, maybe, discretionary spending. Could you kind of outline for us
