what some of the things that are really driving the growth are, and maybe put those into percentages, meaning... I see that the federal government reduced the amount of Medicaid aid or assistance to our state. What is that as a percent of the increase from this year to last year, if you know?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I don't know that exact percent, but I can tell you, in general, some of the changes that we made that have increased some of the spending, and that will be something for For example, we increased the amount for you to consider. community corrections, and you're very familiar with that from your committee. You know, we've had various proposals in connection with community corrections, and at first it was a very large number in a general form, and we on the committee asked for more detail on that. The plan then changed and it's...in fact, it's changed remarkably, but we came out with a proposal, as you know, for \$5.7 million for the expanded community corrections, and the same amount for the following year. But then we also decided, on the committee level, that if we were ever going to finish fixing up this State Capitol Building, that we needed to accelerate the amount of payments that were going into that proposal. And that's...

SENATOR BOURNE: Actually, I had another question about that, but I guess what I'm getting at is, if you look at...when you talk about the \$18 million that we increased that discretionary, for lack of a better way of saying it -- and that's like .3 percent of the entire budget, on page 11, the amount of midbiennium budget adjustments in the committee budget increases fiscal years '05-06, '06-07, by a total of \$18 million. are the adjustments to the various departments of those government, and I guess what I'm saying is, if that's only three-tenths of a percent, what is driving the other 7 percent of the budget's growth? I guess maybe I'm not putting it in a very clear way, but this seems to me to be kind of unusual, in that oftentimes the midbiennium budget really is just kind of an adjustment for heating costs, things like that. And this seems to be a rather significant increase, and I'm trying to get a sense of is it all Medicaid, is it aid to schools? What is driving this growth?
