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SENATOR BOURNE: Okay. So 7 percent of that is \$280 million?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Well, that's...I'm not...we don't usually go at it this way, Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: I just don't have a handle on what...when I read here where it says we increase the spending by 7.3 percent, but yet I read through here and there's nothing in there that really shows that dollar amount on what we're spending that on, and that's...I'm just kind of confused.

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Time, Senator Bourne. Senator Chambers, followed by Senator Combs, Senator Don Pederson. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, I want to divide the question.

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Which question would you like to divide?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: This amendment that we're dealing with, the committee amendment from the Appropriations Committee.

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: We are on an amendment to the committee amendment, and so it's not proper to divide.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay, but at the proper time, that's what I want to do, and I will address this amendment that's before us. I'm opposed to it. I'd like to ask Senator Foley a couple of questions.

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Senator Foley, would you yield?

SENATOR FOLEY: Yes, I will. Thank you.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Foley, the fact that you drafted this or had it drafted makes it clear that you're concerned probably about contraceptive services. Is that correct?

SENATOR FOLEY: That's not accurate, Senator. If you look at this amendment closely and look at who's qualified to provide services under this program under my amendment, you'll notice
