services. This is a permissive provision that further clarifies the number of providers. So at some point, Senator Schimek's testimony that she's reading into the record from the committee hearing, that I believe most, if not all, of the committee were at, was in regards to the green copy of the bill. There was some question from the committee members about, how does it affect with the committee amendment, and...or with the proposed amendment. And most of the testifiers hadn't seen the amendment. And so I don't know if they've had the chance to see the bill since it's been introduced. The contact that I've received was generally asking about the green copy of the bill, and so we had clarified that. So we need to make sure that we're talking about what is actually before us. Senator Foley has stressed to us repeatedly to read the amendment, and I would say that that's probably an appropriate direction. But I wanted to clarify that. Is this appropriate or not? I...you know what, I've been here for six years, and we've done things on this floor that I'm sure is just as inappropriate as anything else that has ever been done in a budget. We do it all the time. Now, whether we do it this way or another way, I think we should have that discussion and figure out what is appropriate. I think what Senator Foley has offered us, at least, is an appropriate idea. And if it needs to be addressed or it needs to be worked on, that's fine. There are shortages in services. It is...I mean, we can go ahead and spend all the money we want to on all the wonderful programs that come out of this Legislature, but I think what we have learned over the last five years since...at least what I have learned, is priorities. And we all have different priorities. Is what Senator Foley offered us probably a priority that I would have thought of when I got in the Legislature? Probably not. And had he not offered it to us today, or this year in front of the Health Committee, had we considered it as a Health Committee, we probably wouldn't have. But now that the issue is before us, I think we should consider it, and I think we should consider it how it fits in with the entire scheme. Could Senator Foley have taken the Appropriations...taken a bill to the Appropriations Committee and asked for increased funding? He certainly could have. And I'm sure a lot of us would have done different things, or could have offered different ideas had we known what the financial state of Nebraska was going to be, before session began, that we
