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talk about it; I wanted to do something.

SENATOR BROWN: Do you think that a woman who has a sexually transmitted disease deserves to have it by virtue of her behavior?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No.

SENATOR BROWN: And do you believe that a woman who has a sexually transmitted disease...

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: One minute.

SENATOR BROWN: ...deserves not to receive treatment for that sexually transmitted disease?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: No.

SENATOR BROWN: Thank you, Senator Chambers. If this is legitimate, why is the last line of the amendment in there? If it is legitimate, why is the last line of the amendment in there? And that's all I would ask. Thank you.

PRESIDENT SHEEHY: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Thompson, followed by Senator McDonald, Senator Chambers. Senator Thompson.

SENATOR THOMPSON: Thank you. I think we should vote for the reconsideration motion and come back and debate these very serious issues that have been highlighted that we kind of raced through earlier. I think there's room for compromise. I think...and I know a number of people are working on an amendment to file for later on—it would be at the bottom of the list—to appropriately increase the funding for these programs. They've run out of money already, before the end of the year. They...the problems that are facing women are significant. But I also think we need to reconsider...and I'm getting to what Senator Brown said. And you know, there aren't very many women serving in the Legislature, and I guess I feel some obligation to speak for those women who would come to these existing services, who are...have a working relationship with them and
