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for...to be able to provide treatment. And what I'm afraid of is that the language of this precludes the ability to do some of the treatment that might be necessary. So discovering things that are wrong and not having any way to remedy it is not a necessarily good situation. Senator Foley, I wondered if you would yield to one more question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Foley.

SENATOR FOLEY: Yes, Mr. President.

SENATOR BROWN: Do you expect this language to last past this next biennium?

SENATOR FOLEY: I have no idea. The next Legislature will deal with the question, but the amendment only is attached to a bill that has a shelf life of one year. The next Legislature will deal with this question again.

SENATOR BROWN: In what way?

SENATOR FOLEY: Because this is a deficit appropriations bill that revises our state budget for the next fiscal year. For the 12 months starting July 1, '06, through June 30, '07,...

SENATOR BROWN: So ...

SENATOR FOLEY: ...we're revising the appropriations figures we set last year,...

SENATOR BROWN: So you intend to have the...only have this last for a year,...

SENATOR FOLEY: This is...

SENATOR BROWN: ...so that you're willing to put a sunset on it?

SENATOR FOLEY: It's got a sunset. This bill dies in 12 months.

SENATOR BROWN: We're not talking about the bill. We're talking about the amendment.
