SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Brown.

SENATOR BROWN: ...this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Brown. Senator Janssen, followed by Senator Thompson.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members of the Legislature. I've just filed an amendment to the A bill that would raise another \$500,000 if we approve Senator Foley's amendment, which it looks like we're probably going to. But I wanted you to be aware that this extra \$500,000 is needed, because if you don't approve this, then the programs that are there are going to suffer. And I don't know whether this was the intent of the amendment, but that's what's going to happen. So if you're going to do this, if you're going to vote for this bill, then put your money where your mouth is. I know that the budget is growing. It's growing leaps and bounds. But it is actions like this that causes that. And are we going to take care of our needy women? Yes, we're going to do that. But when you add other facilities, you had better put your money up front and make sure that it is appropriated for them. Senator Foley, I'd like to ask you a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Foley, would you respond?

SENATOR FOLEY: Yes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Senator Foley, will you support this additional \$500,000?

SENATOR FOLEY: I was just...I visited with Senator Kruse just a moment ago and I talked to Senator Thompson earlier about what we can do on the funding level for this program to try to alleviate this key concern that you've identified for us. And I've made very clear to both those senators, I will support an increased appropriation for this program. However, bear in mind, if you start ratcheting up this program, you're begging for a Governor's veto. You're begging for a line-item veto of that figure.
