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wherewithal to provide those services. It's going to cost more money so, therefore, you're going to, in the whole scheme of things, provide fewer services. And I don't want to see that, and so I don't know if there's room to talk about this. Senator Foley, I guess I better ask you if there's room to talk about this.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Foley, would you respond?

SENATOR FOLEY: Yes, absolutely there's room to talk about this, Senator. I've made it very clear to other members off the mike and even on the mike that I'm willing to talk about the money situation. I don't think doubling a program is prudent. I'll be up front with you on that. I don't think that's prudent.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I don't have any argument with that.

SENATOR FOLEY: Yeah.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I mean we don't even know how...

SENATOR FOLEY: But on this question of...on the question of services, I think we can work with that. I think there's a very good rationale, and I'll use my own time to speak to it, as to why it was...

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay.

SENATOR FOLEY: ...worded the way it was. I won't take your time to do that.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Okay. I appreciate that and maybe we can talk off the mike then. Senator Janssen, some others maybe can talk about this. I appreciate this.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: I appreciate this opportunity to further discussion on this issue because I think it is an important issue. It does address some of the services to some of the most vulnerable people in our society and, you know, we've got great
