SENATOR CHAMBERS: But, Senator Foley, that is not in this bill, is there? All right, then let me...

SENATOR FOLEY: Well, there's plenty on the record that we (inaudible).

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Let me make it simpler. Show me where there's any reference to geography and distance in your language. I'm talking about what your language says. Show me any reference to geography or distance in your language. Is it there?

SENATOR FOLEY: Senator, I think...I think a reasonable person would look to other similar programs...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Foley, do you understand my question, if you please? Do you understand my question?

SENATOR FOLEY: Why don't you try it again, please, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is there any reference in the language of your amendment to geography or distance?

SENATOR FOLEY: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is there anything which says traveling 90 miles is an excessive distance?

SENATOR FOLEY: A reasonable person...

SENATOR FOLEY: No.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So the department is not required to lessen that distance under the language of your amendment, are they? Let's say the department didn't.
