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cleverest thing I ever heard, and I've never forgotten it. It's not something that will make you split your sides, but when I heard that I said, I understand why Don was placed on this earth--that was why he was put here. Senator Don Pederson, are you ready?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I believe that your question involves what was in the actual original bill by the Governor, not the committee amendment.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So this information on this sheet that we have before us,...

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Section 8?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...it's in the green bill book, and it's a part of the committee statement. That information that is the explanation of amendments does not apply to what we're looking at?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: From the information that I've received from the Fiscal Office, the way this is to be handled is found in Sections 8, 20, and 21, which make transfer to the Administrative License Revocation Cash Fund in the Attorney General's Office, and the Attorney General requested \$135,735 in General Funds for this program. What we are doing here is taking unappropriated, unused cash funds, transferring them to the Administration License Revocation Cash Fund, and allowing the Attorney General to use this fund source for fiscal years '06-07, and these transfers are to take place as soon as possible after July 1, '06.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And what is the Attorney General supposed to use all this money that's going to wind up in the Administrative License Revocation Cash Fund? Is there any restriction on how that money is to be used by the Attorney General?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I think that we have previously authorized certain prosecutions by the Attorney General's Office, in conjunction with this, under the Administrative License Revocation Act.
