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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Is this Administrative License Revocation Cash Fund located in the Department of Motor Vehicles or in the Attorney General's Office?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: It's in the Attorney General's Office, as I understand it, now.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So why is it called the Administrative License Revocation Cash Fund, if it doesn't relate to license revocation?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I think it's cash funds that have been developed through the process, and they are located in the Attorney General's Office, under his control.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But these funds can be used for things other than administrative license revocation activities?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I think they're limited strictly to the use for that purpose, under administrative license. You remember a couple of years ago we had a problem involving how those administrative proceedings were to be handled and done through various processes, and now it's being done through the Attorney General's Office.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: The department...well, my time is probably up. I'll put my light on.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You have 30 seconds left, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I couldn't get much done with that, so I'll wait until I'm recognized again. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Senator Bourne.

SENATOR BOURNE: Thank you, Mr. President, members. Would Senator Pederson yield to a real quick question?
