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SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Pederson, would you yield?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And if you will look at the information given to us that we find in the bill book, you can follow me, because it says in Section 8 there is the requirement that \$82,000 will be transferred from the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund to the administrative...to the ALR Cash Fund. We got there.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Um-hum.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then in Section 11, there will be the transfer of the entire unobligated balance in the ALR Cash Fund, as of June 30, 2007, back to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund; correct? So the money is going to come from the Department of Motor Vehicles to the Attorney General's Office. Then, after reposing there for a period of time, it's going to go back to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund, speaking in general terms. Is that correct?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Pederson?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I understand it's just the unexpended amount that will be transferred at the end of the year, and after that it goes away.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But money is going to the Attorney General's Office. Then, after a certain date, if anything is left in that ALR Cash Fund, it would go back to the Department of Motor Vehicles Cash Fund.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes, that's correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right. Then Section 20 requires the transfer of the entire balance in the Department of Justice Cash Fund to the ALR Cash Fund. So that's money that would be moving from one corner of the Attorney General's Office into the ALR, which is in another corner of the Attorney General's Office. Is that true?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes. The entire unspent amount from the last biennium in the Attorney General's Child Protective Cash
