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ALR is unbelievable, and I was amazed that she knew what it was, and she elaborated a little bit and she said, the big joke is that the judge is like Jesus Christ, but the Department of Motor Vehicles is God. And the funny thing about this whole thing is that the information that I received from that meeting is that a lot of times this ALR paperwork isn't even being filled out. What kind of...I'm with Senator Flood. I mean, he's forgotten more about this than I know, but I'll tell you this: I didn't realize it at the time of that hearing, but based...but everybody's eyes are opened at different times through this process. Mine were opened in about 45 minutes of that meeting. I mean, I can't believe, on a second offense drunk driving, a judge is federally mandated to lay down a year of revocation, a license revocation, but the judge realizes that there might not have been any ALR paperwork filled out by that peace officer, or there was. They have to figure out whether there was or not, because they don't want to double up on a revocation. That's insane. I don't even know where to go with it. We'll leave it in Senator Flood and Senator Bourne's capable hands. All I'm telling you is it seems like a mess to me, so I concur. Mr. President, that's all I had. Thanks.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Friend. Senator Schimek would like to thank the Homestead Girl Scout Council for providing the cookies. We thank you very much and appreciate it with every bit we take. Thank you very much. On with discussion. Senator Preister.

SENATOR PREISTER: Thank you, Honorable President. Thank you, Senator Schimek and Girl Scouts for sweetening us up. It couldn't happen at a more appropriate time. Senator Pederson, I'd like to ask you a question, if I could. The amount of money that we are providing to NDEQ for the Superfund site is what I'd like a little clarification on. That money is the 20 percent match that the state is required to provide to the Superfund sites. I know that we have at least three in Nebraska: the Mead site, there's a site in Grand Island, and there's the Omaha lead Superfund site. Does this match go to all of our state match, for all of our sites, or is this specifically for the Mead site?
