SENATOR RAIKES: ...of restoration or maintenance to these buildings that's the responsibility of the individual institution that uses the building. Is that correct?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes. Over the last ten years, it's my understanding that through 2003-2004, the university system has renovated and constructed buildings with a cost amounting to about \$780 million, and state tax dollars paid for \$153 million of that. And the state colleges renovated buildings with a cost amounting to about \$30 million. So they've been doing their part, as they had monies to do it. But what we're asking for now is a renovation on a greater scale.

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, just...you mentioned \$780 million. Where did that money come from? Seven hundred and eighty million dollars I think you mentioned.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes.

SENATOR RAIKES: Where did that money come from?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: This comes from the university itself, and I don't know the exact funds, but the foundation primarily. I'm informed that a good share of that comes from the University Foundation, which is money that's been contributed by various people throughout the state to help control that. The university is responsible for paying off of their own bonds and things of that nature, but this particular construction, I think, is primarily contributed to by the foundation and private individuals.

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, that's an interesting point. So if someone donates money to build a building on the university campus,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...is that then a state building, or is that...who owns that building?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Well, we've had situations where people
