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certainly agree with the intent here that it's important for the state to have a strong university. I think that buildings are certainly important in a number of ways to the university, to attract students as well as a number of other areas. I am a little disappointed that there is not more of a long-term plan that's offered along with this. It seems to me that we're really saying that this is going to go on forever, without really saying this is going to go on forever. And if this amount of money is not adequate to really address the issues that need to be addressed,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...I would like to know what amount of money would be adequate. If there is a possibility that we could do LB 605 and then somehow there would be other sources that would cover the needs, once the end of this came, I would like to know about that. If it's not possible for that to happen, I think we should be straight and square that that's the way it is, and that there's going to be just a continuing, ongoing obligation. So again, I support the notion here, certainly, and the effort. It's just that I'm a little disappointed that there's not more of a longer-term look taken at what this is about. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Raikes. Further discussion? Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Raikes, I'd yield you my time, if you want it. Otherwise, I would waive my right to speak.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, did you wish to use Senator Beutler's time for further discussion?

SENATOR RAIKES: No thanks.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Okay. I'd yield my time back to the Chair.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Further discussion? There are no lights on. Senator Pederson, you're recognized to close on AM1845.
