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from that individual, as is outlined in Senator Stuhr's amendment, I think you have to be very careful. One of the things I will say, in that...reading through the amendment this morning, most of the conduct prohibited by the amendment is already illegal under current law. For example, first-degree false imprisonment prohibits the restraining or abduction of another person with intent to hold him or her in a condition of involuntary servitude. We passed child pornography statutes a couple years ago that prohibits the enticement, inducement, or employment of a person under 18 to engage in a visual depiction, including live performances, of especially...sexually explicit conduct. Pandering and debauching minors are prohibited. And the enticement or luring of a minor into prostitution is currently illegal. I do want to go through the amendment briefly, just to bring to your attention some of the things that we look for in the Judiciary Committee. Page 1 of the amendment talks about blackmail. Blackmail is to be given its ordinary meaning and includes but is not limited to a threat to expose any secret tending to subject any person to hatred, contempt, or ridicule. One of the things we would ask ourselves in the Judiciary Committee, does this fit with our current definition of blackmail? So we would go through every section of statute that relates to blackmail to determine whether or not this definition, subject any person to hatred, contempt, or ridicule, conflicts with any of the other blackmail statutes or definitions or references to blackmail throughout our statutes. The next sentence: Commercial sexual activity means any sex act on account of which anything of value is given, promised to, or received by any other person. We would go through our...all of our statutes now, oftentimes hundreds of pages, and we would ask, do we define commercial sexual activity currently in the law? If we do, does this new definition comport with that current definition of commercial sexual activity? If there is no such definition in statute now, we would go through every section of statute that references commercial sexual activity, sexual activity, illegal sexual activity, to find out whether or not division...this provision contradicts anything else in statute.
