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whether there were some perimeters in what this money could be used for, see if that would be developed before we were putting the money out. I think if we're going to spend the money, we really should have some guidelines on where it should go, rather than just talk about assisting schools, because that can cover a large part of the area. In the schools in some of my districts, why, we do have problems, and we need grant money to start some of these special classes for some of the newer technologies that are coming about, and that's what I'd be interested in, to know whether or not this money would be available for schools that would be working along that line.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Louden. Further discussion, Stuhr amendment, Senator Mines.

SENATOR MINES: Thank you, Mr. President, colleagues. Would Senator Stuhr yield?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Stuhr, would you yield to a question?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes.

SENATOR MINES: Thanks, Senator Stuhr. As I read your amendment, several questions come to mind. First of all, are all schools eligible for this grant funding?

SENATOR STUHR: Yes, they are, Senator Mines.

SENATOR MINES: Okay.

SENATOR STUHR: We actually changed the wording in last...in the previous bill, we were talking about districts, but we have changed that to schools, so all schools across the state of Nebraska.

SENATOR MINES: All schools have the ability to make application.
