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counseling. In that case, there would probably have to be a change in academic, or in the school staff. Or you could see a situation...a couple of different situations. One, where this is basically already being done now, in which no change would be required, or in which there is the counseling staff available to do this, but they're simply not at the moment directing their efforts in this manner.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Now one other question, I guess--well, two other, but one of them if we have time. A lot of these schools have their days towards the end of the school year, when they bring in different colleges, they bring in work force people, and I think they call it, what, a curriculum day, or whatever they call it, anyway. Could that pass for taking care of something like this, or is this something that has to be done at the beginning of the school year, when the kids are down in the eighth grade?

SENATOR RAIKES: My notion would be that the career day, if that's the right term,...

SENATOR LOUDEN: Yeah.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...would serve a different objective.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR RAIKES: It may well, after a student attends an event like that, they may well have a change of mind, in terms of what their postsecondary objective is.

SENATOR LOUDEN: And...

SENATOR RAIKES: Instead of going to a four-year college, I might decide a community college looks better. What this would say...

SENATOR LOUDEN: Okay, now can you explain what (2)(b) on your amendment means, down at the bottom of the page there: within ten days after student's enrollment.
