Senator Pahls gave us today, that prevents us from actually meeting the curriculum and putting the money into the actual classroom. It is absolutely essential that we in the state of Nebraska have school districts that are out there working directly with their students, knowing who their students are, knowing what they want to accomplish. That is essential, okay?

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR ERDMAN: But devoting limited resources—even though they are substantial in total—but devoting limited resources in addition to what we're already asking the schools to do, to doing another plan similar to what we do for special ed and other things, as I would see this, even though it is more flexible, I just have great reservation about doing that. And I don't discount the passion and the desire of Senator Stuhr and others to see this issue resolved. I just don't believe that this is the solution to that problem. But I'll again listen, but I'm looking to see how these groups and others that support this think that this is somehow going to improve the quality of education in our current structure, knowing we have a limited problem, and also at the same time trying to meet other standards that are taking away resources from the classroom.
