or exceeds \$750,000 would the language adopted in Senator Foley's amendment, AM2441, be left in effect. I'm concerned about what is going to happen if we open up, you might say, more territory, and the funding is not there for Senator Foley's bill. If it's not there, and other equal or additional appropriations are not funding those programs, I'm afraid that would weaken the rest of the programs that are in place. And there are...well, there are 12 agencies. But I have some diagrams here--I haven't passed them around--but there are 24 locations in the state that covers most all of the state right now. There are some areas that...in the center of Nebraska where the population, of course, is not as large as it is in the eastern and in the western part of the state, and the southern part of the state. In order for us to, I think, adequately adopt Senator Foley's bill, I think that it is appropriate that we add this additional funding, so that his program can at least move forward without any restrictions or diluting the programs that are already out there. If anyone...that's my opening on the amendment. It's \$250,000 extra to fund the new program, Senator Foley's bill. And if we fall upon times when we cannot fund that, then I think it's reasonable that we should stay with what we have in place. That's the thrust of my amendment, and I would try to answer any questions anyone would have. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Janssen. You've heard the opening on AM2744. We will recognize some of Senator Schrock's guests before we go to discussion. (Visitors introduced.) On with discussion. Senator Schimek.

SENATOR SCHIMEK: Yes, thank you, Mr. President and members. I rise in support of the amendment and hope that this can facilitate this discussion this morning and perhaps allow us to come to some kind of an agreement. One of the things that Senator Jensen mentioned is that there weren't just 14 clinics across the state that have these services. There are actually 14 areas, but each of these areas can have satellite offices, too. So I think, Senator Jensen, if I'm not mistaken, there are 36 of these clinics across the state. And I'd just like to give you an example. For instance, I got this list yesterday. There is...Chadron is the area office, but besides Chadron, then
