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here...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Uh-huh.

SENATOR FOLEY: ...that's going to be divvied up among whatever number of providers eventually show up.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes, but, Senator Foley, that...if the need was there and you came in...say we needed 100 more of these in the state, say something came up that we really did need these, don't you think that someone would come before the Appropriations Committee and say, we're going to need extra dollars for this?

SENATOR FOLEY: Oh, they surely would, but there's nothing in this particular amendment that gives anybody that kind of comfort that next year, even with more money, that they will get what they got the previous year, because we simply don't know how many providers are going to show up once the doors are opened.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, this is what's budgeted for them this year.

SENATOR FOLEY: That's right. It's a one-year...this is a one-year piece of legislation. That's right.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Right. Right. Well, it's on the biennium.

SENATOR FOLEY: And none of us know how many providers...

SENATOR JANSSEN: And each time we have...we work the budget over, it will come up again.

SENATOR FOLEY: Yeah, but for this particular year, this one year that's directly impacted by your language,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Uh-huh.

SENATOR FOLEY: ...without knowing how many providers will be dividing that finite pot of money, we don't know how much any
