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SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator McDonald. Further discussion? Senator Erdman, followed by Senator Aguilar.

SENATOR ERDMAN: Thank you, Mr. President. In an effort to facilitate the discussion between Senator Foley and Senator Janssen, I'd yield my time to Senator Foley.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Foley.

SENATOR FOLEY: Thank you, Senator Erdman, for the time. Senator Janssen, I wonder if we can continue just a bit here, and I won't tie up on that matter because I think you...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Yes. Sure.

SENATOR FOLEY: ...I think we addressed that to the extent that you were inclined to. But let's move on to another topic here, and that's this language on page 7...excuse me, lines 7 and 8 of your amendment,...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Uh-huh. All right.

SENATOR FOLEY: ...which...and the way that I interpret this language, I hope you can correct me if I'm wrong, but the way that I interpret your language, if the Governor were to line-item veto even one dollar or more out of this 50 percent increase, then the language we adopted yesterday vanishes.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Correct.

SENATOR FOLEY: Is that correct? Is that your intent?

SENATOR JANSSEN: Correct.

SENATOR FOLEY: I want to make sure I'm reading it correctly.

SENATOR JANSSEN: If that appropriation is not there, then the last two lines, 7 and 8, would take effect.
