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and come up with something that everyone can agree on, the truth with a capital T, that being, how many more women do we want to serve, how many more clinics are we able to fund, and how much exactly is it going to cost without causing extreme harm to any of the providers involved? That's where we need to be, because the focus, as we've said, is on the women. The women are the focus, the women that need these services. I think we could argue this all day and, you know, I've got a personal preference one way or the other. My personal opinion, I am against abortion. I am also in favor of good public health policy for the people that are on the receiving end of it, provided in the most efficient and affordable, available way. So I say let's go for that third side. Let's go for the truth with a capital T. Let the chips fall where they may. Find out how much it's going to cost. Let's go there and let the Governor veto it. Let's get something we can all stick together on and get 30 votes. The veto should be the least of our worries right now. Let's all stick together. If this is what we want, I think we've heard enough debate to know that this is what we want, and let's go for it and let's put aside these, you know, the...you know, this...everyone is talking about, this is pro-abortion, pro-life, this is, you know, pro-choice and whatever. Let's focus on what we all want, and that is accessible healthcare...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR COMBS: ...for the women that are getting these services. And it is...as Senator Foley said, most of what's provided is not what was in that upper section that I discussed with Senator Chambers yesterday, the colposcopies and, you know, the invasive procedures that require, you know, a gynecologist. Most of what's provided are Pap and pelvics and STD diagnoses and antibiotics. And certainly other services are available, but this is what women need. And I say, if as a body we agree on where we throw that rock out to truth with a capital T, beyond the two sides that are deadlocked right now, we can get there before Select File and we can have 30 voted to do it, if we all want to stick together and try to come to an agreement together. That's all I have to offer.
