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SENATOR JANSSEN: (Microphone malfunction) Not yet,
(inaudible).

SENATOR FOLEY: Well,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: It is coming, Senator.

SENATOR FOLEY: It's coming. Yeah, I think we've got a meeting
of the minds. I wouldn't mind reading it, though, if that's all
right. (Laugh) And...thank you, Senator. So we're going to
increase the funding, as you have suggested, to the level that
you suggested, Senator, and we're going to strike that language
that would have attempted to set up a series of consequences if
the money were somehow vetoed or reduced in some other fashion.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Exactly.

SENATOR FOLEY: Yes. I'm with you, Senator. Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: Okay. Thank you, Senator Foley.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Janssen, are you...

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, I would...I'm either done or I can close
on that amendment, whichever you'd like. (Laugh)

SENATOR CUDABACK: No. No, I'm sorry, but you can't close on
the amendment. You're opening, Senator, so... (Laughter)

SENATOR JANSSEN: Well, Senator Cudaback, I did have a pause in
there. I gave a little of my time to Senator Foley. Apparently
that doesn't count. All right. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You may continue. You have 7 minutes left,
if you wish to use it, on your opening. You have 7 minutes if
you care. I'm not shutting you off.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. Now is it permissible that I ask
for a consent on this, on the amendment, which now the amendment
leaves the \$250,000 in the increase and takes out the language
