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that if the funding is not there that the bill does not go away, the funding doesn't go away? So that is what the amendment is and...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator, you are opening.

SENATOR JANSSEN: All right. Yes. That's what it is.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you.

SENATOR JANSSEN: I don't know what else to say.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Okay. You give your time back to me then, right? Thank you. Now we're open for discussion on FA608. Open for discussion. Senator Don Pederson.

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Thank you, Mr. President. Seems like a long time ago that we started talking about this when we were...I thought we were going to talk about the budget, and we've ended up talking about this for some period of time. And I think it's been a healthy discussion, though, and I think that we have worked through the concerns that people have. It's interesting that for ten years we, on the Appropriations Committee, did not receive any requests for additional funding for this particular service that is being provided for women. We understand now, from the discussion here, that there's not enough money that's been put into this program. So with Senator Janssen's proposal and with Senator Foley's approval, we will now have additional monies and, from the appropriations standpoint, I believe that it's appropriately spent in this regard. I think that we're all concerned about women's health and I think this meets that issue. I think we have the assurances that we have a program that will go forward and will actually perhaps expand the services. Hopefully it will expand the services and it will...some of the concerns like what express...what were expressed by Senator Aguilar and Senator Howard and many other of the members of this Legislature. We all want the same thing. It's taken a long time to get there, but I believe we've achieved it. I hope that you will all vote for the amendment by Senator Janssen. Thank you.
