SENATOR CONNEALY: Thank you, Mr. President. Members, thank you all for the discussion and the pros and cons. I think it was a good discussion. You know, we have challenges everywhere in the You know, kids in the most affluent school district can have challenges. But if you look at a group, our Native American population does have huge challenges. And as we instituted No Child Left Behind in this state and in the nation, the Department of Education saw that they were going to have a real hard time making big gains in the Native American schools, and also in the Native American population of students in other schools across the state, unless they made an effort to do that. And so they added a couple positions that were going to address that. Because of our tough budget times, they went ahead and found federal funds to do that. But we've been given a gift. We've been shown that they actually work. Now the federal funds are not there, but I believe that this is money that's going to be well spent, if it comes from our General Fund budget. I'd urge your support of AM2677.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Connealy. You've heard the closing on AM2677. The question before the body is, shall that amendment be adopted to the committee amendments to LB 1060?
