And I hope you will all recall that a year ago you were very supportive in passing LB 264. Nancy Thompson was very supportive also at that time, and assisted me in obtaining TANF funds, \$200,000 in TANF funds, to start the program. And what we looked at doing was a targeted program in the Douglas and Sarpy County area. intervention programming focuses on prevention of child abuse and neglect by offering screening, education, and visitation to at-risk families. You may recall from the discussion on the floor last year that the home visitation intervention was the first recommendation of then Governor Johanns' child task force. The task force, brought together in the wake of 30 children deaths, reviewed studies that suggested that approximately 40 percent of maltreatment episodes could be prevented through early childhood home visits; 40 percent of
