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Howard, who are so concerned about foster children and Medicare and all of the different social programs, and who had bills before the Appropriations Committee for several million dollars for those programs...and I'm not picking on Senator Howard. I'm just saying, everybody who is concerned about all of these different programs, they're going to find themselves very frustrated next year if there is any program that they wish to save that will going by the bye, because it seems quite clear that we will be faced with a bigger problem in this respect next year than we have faced in my time in the Legislature; that is, there will be serious cutbacks coming from the federal government. I won't be here, so I guess I don't have to worry about it. But I would think a great many of you, Senator Jensen and others, concerned about healthcare, will be hoping and praying that there are some revenues available to salvage some of these programs. And my guess will be, every one of you in here will have one or more programs that you will want to save or to mitigate the damage to. And that ought to be on your mind as you have this discussion today. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Beutler. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, in the vernacular of the street, I'm mad. In the strict sense of that word, it means insane or unbalanced. I mean it in the sense of angry, morally outraged, righteously indignant. I'd like to ask Senator Landis a question.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Landis, would you yield to a question from Senator Chambers?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Landis, your amendment, AM2800, which was added to first division, is not directly connected to what the first division is about; namely, the removal of those taxes on construction and so forth. Isn't that true?

SENATOR LANDIS: You know, I got down in the list of points, and there was a substantial point that I did raise, and that was the \$10 million for the ethanol. I did mention it, and it is...it fits there best of all. But it is not a sales tax provision,
