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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Senator. Members of the Legislature, through nobody's fault other than mine, I was occupied with other matters when Senator Landis' amendment came up, and I did not...I was not aware of what his amendment did, because I thought we were talking just about these sales tax exemptions, until I heard Senator Redfield mention ethanol. When I went back to ask her was she talking about this amendment that was before us, Senator Landis was closing, so there was no opportunity for me to express my opposition. But I'm preparing an amendment to strike that from the first division. And if it's not stricken, then the bill, as far as I'm concerned, is wrong. And you all have all of your negotiations,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...you've done all that you need...thank you, I'm going to put my light on one more time, and maybe Senator Brown will be kind enough to let me speak.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Senator Brown, your light is next. Senator Brown waives her opportunity. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature. In fact, Senator Chambers, I'm going to give you some of my own time, knowing that you're in opposition to the position that I've got. Exactly, we will have plenty of opportunity to entertain a motion to strike the ethanol language. It will be timely. In fact, this will be the division. It will come, I think, right after the Byars amendment, and would be appropriate, and I'm sure we'll get to it today. As far as 33 votes, look, if we can't do this package with 33 votes, we probably shouldn't do it anyway, so I think that's legitimate. Probably 33 votes is appropriate. And understand, we asked for an E clause in the last amendment. We raised the bar to 33, not Senator Chambers. We did. And I would agree with him, in fact, if we can't do this 100 million bucks by 33 votes, probably we shouldn't do it. I can live with that, so I'm with that. As far as the Brown amendment, understand, it had 3 no votes in the Revenue Committee, but did
