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SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Eth...(laugh) Senator "Ethanol" is Senator Connealy. I've been waiting to hit him with that. Senator Wehrbein, there have been unintended,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...unforeseen developments in the matter of subsidizing ethanol production which have taken place over the years. Isn't that accurate?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Like, what are you referring to? I'm not...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Well, are you aware of anything that has happened which was not anticipated or foreseen, let's say in terms of the number of plants which are going to gain subsidies?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: On that basis, yes. Yes, um-hum.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. And that's all I will ask you. Thank you. Senator Landis spearheaded an amendment, totalling \$10 million, for an industry where predictions were inappropriately made already. That didn't stop the legislators from obliging the state to be in hock for millions and millions and millions of dollars. So then we come to something like...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...housing for the poor, and that's out. We come to something like Senator Byars' amendment,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh, thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. Senator Redfield, followed by Senator Chambers.

SENATOR REDFIELD: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. Senator Byars was gracious enough to come to me last week and tell me he was going to file this amendment. I actually have several of these facilities in District 12, and they do
