SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Now, Senator Wehrbein, you and Senator Brown were speaking about E-85. There are more vehicles right now that can burn E-85 than there is E-85 to fuel them. Are you aware of that?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes. Uh-huh.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And are you also aware that these vehicles can run on regular gasoline also?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that's what most of them are running on right now.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes, many people don't know they have a dual machine.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Are you aware that the auto industry gets tax benefits, whether credits or checkoffs or whatever, whatever the term that's been used, for the production of alternative vehicles, whether or not there is fuel for them? Are you aware of those benefits the auto industry is getting?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I would assume that, yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And that's why they're producing these alternative fuel vehicles, not because they're concerned about ethanol or anything else. Are you aware that there used to be a very sweet tax benefit that went to companies that tried to extract fuel from coal?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: And they cut that out because it was strictly a boondoggle and they never got anywhere with it in terms of making it viable.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I think there's still activity there, Senator Chambers, what I've been...understand.
