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Revenue Committee put our heads together in the back of the room and said, yes, we can live with this adjustment. I would ask for this. It will treat a housing authority as if, essentially, they were a private citizen who was remodeling their house, under what we did for them. And this should mean hundreds of thousands of dollars of benefit to the housing authorities in this state. I ask for the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the opening on FA619. Open for discussion. Seeing no lights on, Senator Landis, did you wish to close on the amendment? Senator Landis, did you wish to close?

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. Just to clarify, we're talking about the labor and the materials used in remodeling and construction. They would be tax-exempt for a housing authority. I ask for the adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the closing on FA619. The question before the body is, shall that amendment be adopted? All in favor vote aye; all opposed vote nay. The question before the body is the Landis-Chambers-Brown amendment, FA619. Have you all voted on the question who care to? Record please, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of the amendment to the committee amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: FA619 has been adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further pending to this portion of the committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Back to discussion of the first portion, committee amendments. There are no lights on. The question before the body is, shall the first portion...I'm sorry? Senator Landis, did you wish to close? I got ahead of myself.

SENATOR LANDIS: There it is.
