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community...the various community college branches together over the summer and working on it. I was still on the Revenue Committee the following January; nothing had been done. against Senator Flood's tax increase for Northeast Community College last year because the funding formula is flawed. voted... I did, when I was on the Appropriations Committee, had cut the community colleges, and we did give them an additional levy authority to increase their levy to respond to some of the funding cuts they incurred. But I won't support Senator Louden's amendment, I didn't support Senator Flood's amendment, because there is a fundamental flaw in the formula, and nobody seems to want to address it. I don't know if it's one community college fighting with the other, but there's a problem. I don't think we should throw good money after bad if the funding formula is flawed. I did notice that in the appropriations bill that went across, there was some additional funding for community colleges. I didn't say anything at the time, but I'm going to be looking at that at Select File, because the formula is flawed. It's time to address the issue, grab the bull by the horns, so to speak, Senator Louden, and resolve the problem, not just keep throwing money at it.
