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SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Mr. President. Would Senator Raikes yield for a question, please?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, are you available? He's on his way.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Okay. I was wondering if Senator Landis can fill me in on...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes is there, Senator.

SENATOR LOUDEN: ...on greenbelting. Would Senator Landis yield?

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes is also there, Senator Louden.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Oh, okay. Senator Raikes, if he's there.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Raikes, we're back to square one.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Thank you, Senator. Well, my understanding of the greenbelting is so that if there is agricultural land close to a city, that it will still be valued as agricultural land. Is that correct?

SENATOR RAIKES: You are right, Senator, valued for tax purposes,...

SENATOR LOUDEN: Right.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...as agricultural land.

SENATOR LOUDEN: Land. Now, when you...the way I read your bill, when you say the house and then six acres or something like that, is...I mean, how...who's going to decide whether that should be greenbelted if it's 6 acres or 5.5 or 17 or where it is, because depending on the part of the country you're in, the size that goes along with that house could still be greenbelted agricultural land; am I correct?

SENATOR RAIKES: Well, I think that's...you've hit on the point
