I appreciate the help with AM2779. Again, I appreciate the help with the committee amendment, and thank you, Senator McDonald. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Friend. Senator McDonald.

SENATOR McDONALD: Mr. President and members of the body, I do support Senator Friend's amendment and also Senator Chambers'. I think you'll all remember the bill last year--and this was a bill for an interim study for cemetery issues--and as we debated it on the floor, we found that it really wasn't necessary to put that in state statute. And Senator Ray Janssen, the committee Chair for General Affairs, agreed to an interim study, which was done last year. The bill was still left on Select File, had never been removed, and you'll remember that Senator Chambers had put an indefinitely postpone motion on that, which...so it was just there waiting, and so thanks to Senator Friend, he recognized that, brought it to my attention, and overwhelmingly supported that bill and that amendment. So please support this. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you. There are no lights on. Senator Chambers, you're recognized to close on your amendment, AM2779.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. President, as I stated, I'm going to support the bill, and I'll repeat, this is not the kind of legislation that I support with a great amount of comfort. As we were just discussing under the balcony, the funeral itself is a form of speech, and if Mr. A can speak, Ms. B must be allowed to speak, also. You cannot take the content of the speech and say, this is what makes it good, and because somebody has a counter view, that speech is bad. Senator Beutler, and I don't think he'll mind me mentioning it, mentioned that in some countries where a person is killed, you will see people in the street, while the body is being transported to wherever the burial will take place, sometimes firing guns in the air, sometimes expressing all kinds of different points of view, but they're not hostile and they're not unfriendly, but there
