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SENATOR CHAMBERS: So if we adopt this amendment, there would have to be an A bill attached to this bill, correct?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That was my understanding, and if we have an A bill, then we don't need this language; would that be correct?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: That would be correct.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. I'd like to ask Senator Burling a question or two now.

SENATOR BOURNE: Senator Burling?

SENATOR BURLING: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Burling, if an A bill is prepared, do you think the body is going to support an appropriation of \$200,000 for this program, and before you answer that, if you can tell me briefly exactly what this bill does. When people get these grants, what is to be done with them?

SENATOR BURLING: The Commission on Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice would be receiving the money, and then they would prepare applications. That would be their decision on how...

SENATOR CHAMBERS: But here is what I mean. What is the purpose of the money? When somebody gets the money, what are they supposed to do with it?

SENATOR BURLING: It designates it primarily, and really only for preventative drug abuse education in local communities.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So it's designed to give information to people?

SENATOR BURLING: Yes, we've addressed treatment and other forms of drug problems, after they get involved, but we need to get to the treatment problems.
