But let's have a comprehensive approach. Let's do something that makes a difference. I'm afraid that \$200,000 for 22,000-plus meth addicts and hundreds and thousands of impressionable children across our state...we need to make sure we're doing it right, and \$200,000 will not accomplish what we're doing. I'm not against educating people in Nebraska about meth treatment; I am against throwing our money at something that we are not guaranteed results with, and we are not guaranteed results with this. We are not guaranteed to see a reduction, and this will not save us money in the long run, because we don't have a plan. And if Mr. John Ferrone...

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR FLOOD: ...from Hastings wants to put together a plan, I'd look forward to reading it. But his recommendation to the meth treatment study said nothing about the need for educating Nebraskans about the dangers of methamphetamine. Mr. Ferrone did not talk about the need to educate our children. He did not focus on that in the study, and therefore, it's hard for me to understand that the people in the community of Hastings would see that it's overlooked. I strongly object to AM2690. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Flood. Speaker Brashear, you're recognized.

SPEAKER BRASHEAR: Thank you, Mr. President, members of the body. It has been suggested to me that some of you would appreciate a forecast of what we'll do tomorrow.
