SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...to somebody else to use. And it might make them pay more attention to what's happening, because these things usually happen in certain areas; do you agree? It's not likely to happen in the middle of an apartment complex, where you might have three floors of apartments, and somebody's going to have a meth lab, and nobody knows about it.

SENATOR AGUILAR: Well, I think I would disagree with that, Senator Chambers. Many times it does happen that way. Many times it happens in a motel room; many times it happens in a private residence.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: So in the example that I gave, where you have an apartment complex, three floors of apartments, you're saying many times they've found meth labs in a setting like that?

SENATOR AGUILAR: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd like to see some examples of that, but not at this point. I'm going to oppose your amendment, Senator Aguilar, because I think LB 915 gives...it gives a starting point to see whether or not this kind of legislation has any value.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would say this.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Time, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Oh. Thank you, Mr. President.
