SENATOR CUDABACK: AM2651 has been adopted.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further pending to committee amendments.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Mr. Clerk. Seeing no lights on, Vice Chairman of the committee, you're recognized to close on the committee amendments.

SENATOR CONNEALY: Once again, this limits the application to a credit for \$30,000 per project.

SENATOR CUDABACK: You've heard the closing by Senator Connealy. The question before the body is, shall the Revenue Committee amendments be adopted to LB 990? All in favor of the motion vote aye; opposed, nay. The question before the body is adoption of the committee amendments by the Revenue Committee. Have you all voted who care to? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays on the adoption of the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Committee amendments have been adopted. Mr. Clerk, first motion when you get time.

ASSISTANT CLERK: Senator Wehrbein would offer AM2562. (Legislative Journal page 865.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, to open on your amendment to LB 990.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This was a disclosure provision that was inadvertently left out. It was intended to be the same disclosure provision that was in the original bill, and it was inadvertently left out, and I intended to have that. It discloses the details of the proposal like it does with other businesses, and I simply wanted to be sure that that was in the bill, and that's all it does. It's almost technical, but it isn't quite.
