SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. You've heard the opening on AM2562, an amendment to LB 990. Open for discussion. Senator Wehrbein, there are no lights on. Senator Wehrbein waives closing. The question before the body is, shall AM2562 be adopted? All in favor vote aye; opposed vote nay. The question before the body is adoption of AM2562 to LB 990. Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Wehrbein's amendment.

SENATOR CUDABACK: The Wehrbein amendment has been adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill, Senator Chambers' FA575. (Legislative Journal page 986.)

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Chambers, you are recognized to open on FA575.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This is an amendment that Senator Wehrbein looked at, and he has no problem with it. It's one of those that just cleans up a little bit of language. We would strike where the amendment mentions it, the word "under," and insert "pursuant to" this act, and we would strike the word "less," and substitute the word "fewer," and that's all that this amendment does, so I am asking that it be adopted. Then when we get to the next one, Senator Wehrbein and I, in the way that gentlemen do on this floor, will have a little set-to to determine what will become of that next amendment, but this one is one with which he agrees. And to make sure that I'm not misstating anything, I'd like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question, if he would yield.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, would you yield?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, is this the amendment that you find no problem with?
