SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you. Mr. President and members of the Legislature, I'd like to ask Senator Wehrbein a question or two.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Wehrbein, would you yield to a question or two?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Senator Wehrbein, being from the city, I probably shouldn't even be in these discussions but I do have an interest in this area. On the pink slip, this is the language that I see: The bill allows livestock producers to apply under regular LB 608 provisions and the new livestock provisions, without any provisions regarding how to compute the overlapping benefits. So if this pink slip is correct, there are overlapping benefits when a person can apply under the usual or regular LB 608 provisions plus these new ones. If there is an overlapping of benefits, shouldn't there be some way to compute this when this occurs, or isn't it necessary?

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Well, if you want to clarify...and I'm willing to do that, preferably on Select File.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I see your sentence that you're talking about.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: The new livestock provisions, any provisions regarding how to compute the overlapping benefits. This is not intended, from my viewpoint, to have overlapping benefits; I will say that up front. And if it's not clear or if there is a question, I'm certainly willing to clarify that. My intent was, you can pick one or the other. And if you've noticed, in the handout I did state that. You can use the tier that's there now which is \$125,000 investment and two new employees, or you can go the investment route only in agriculture which is what this one is, and it's not intended to overlap.
