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that was not being fully utilized. The way I understand it, the last few months there's been very...has been an increase in applications.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Okay. Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Members of the Legislature, I had said last session, I think it was, when I was trying to get some money into an A bill that would help the rural community, and I was, in effect, told to keep my nose out of their business because they had made what they call a compromise where the cities got everything and they got practically nothing, and that's what they liked, so I told them, well, I'll stay out of you all's affairs then. But I do think sometimes they need an advocate, but I'm not going to be that advocate.

SENATOR CUDABACK: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll just raise questions and put them before others whom the rural people don't mind having handle their affairs the best they can under all the facts of the situation. Right now, I have an amendment, and when I close I will explain it. Thank you, Mr. President.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Chambers. Further discussion? Senator Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I just wanted to call attention, Mr. President and members, the bottom of page 8 and the top of page 9, there is a statement, "For each application, a taxpayer engaged in livestock production may qualify for a credit under either subsection (1) or (2) of this section, but cannot qualify for more than one credit per application." So if that's not clear enough, I'll work with you, Senator Chambers, but there is no intent to get into the double-dipping.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Beutler.

SENATOR BEUTLER: Senator Cudaback, I would waive my opportunity to speak.
