SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: I think you're the one to ask this, Senator Pederson. How is the status now, the funding of the Law Enforcement Training Center at Grand Island? Originally, we were going to all tuition based. Apparently there's going to still continue to be some General Funds?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: Yes, there would still be General Funds as it's structured currently, yes.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Is that significant General Funds, or are we still on track to...how does this alter that? Or does Senator Flood have...?

SENATOR D. PEDERSON: I'm not sure. I think there's about \$290,000 that we're...that we're talking about for General Funds. And it certainly didn't work out exactly as it was understood initially. When you and I understood the setup originally, it was supposed to have been accomplished by tuition, and that just simply hasn't taken place, and so it's been necessary to have some funds. And we've lost some federal funds that were participating in this program, so we're having to supplement it in order to keep it appropriate. And I think
