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transition takes some effort and time, and probably more money than anticipated, but I was kind of wondering. I think it's important for the whole body to understand this as we move forward, as to what that is, because it continue probably be somewhat of a drag on the General Fund. And maybe it never will work out to be tuition-based and supported. I mean, I was just kind of interested in the whole process. So thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Wehrbein. Senator Flood, you're next to speak.

SENATOR FLOOD: I'll be real brief. Thank you, Mr. President. I want to be very clear that we are not increasing fees here or going above and beyond anything that's currently available as far as funding in our current court fee schedule. So if you are coming in this morning and you're wondering where is this money coming from, why are we sending some more money to Grand Island, why are we sending some money to Legal Aid, the answer to your question is that this is not a new fee. This is a continuation of a court fee that's been in place for some time. Sheriffs and city police across this state are very interested in this on the training side, and obviously the indigent and those that need representation are interested on the Legal Aid side. So I would ask for your adoption of this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CUDABACK: Thank you, Senator Flood. Senator Synowiecki.

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: Thank you, Senator Cudaback, members. I apologize, Senator. Senator Flood, would you yield? As I understand it, this amendment was just put on this morning, so I haven't had a chance to kind of conceptualize what's going on here. Let me try to understand that the Legal Aid of Nebraska now will have a dedicated dollar court fee for...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator...

SENATOR SYNOWIECKI: ...delivering services to the poor,...

SENATOR CUDABACK: Senator Flood.
