back when we had some incentive dollars and no one used them. Is that accurate?

SENATOR RAIKES: Yeah. If you go back a number of years, there have been...

SENATOR SMITH: A number of years. What do you mean?

SENATOR RAIKES: Oh, five, seven, something like that. There have been programs when not...well, in fact, there's been a program of sorts in place for lots of years. Most of the time, that money was used, maybe not all of it, but most of the time it was used.

SENATOR SMITH: But we came in and took some of the reorganization...or, reorganization incentive dollars and channeled them in a different direction. Is that accurate?

SENATOR RAIKES: No, I don't think that would be accurate.

SENATOR SMITH: Okay. I truly cannot recall, so I'm...that's why I'm trying to get...

SENATOR RAIKES: Yeah. I think the accurate statement would be that we did not have any reorganization incentive program in place, and then in 2005, '04 or '05, maybe 2000...or, the 2004 Session, we...the Legislature made the decision to fund a reorganization program using lottery money, at the rate of \$1 million per year for two years. So I think...

SENATOR SMITH: Okay.

SENATOR RAIKES: ...we're in the second and final year now.

SENATOR SMITH: And so you're merely extending that. Is that accurate?

SENATOR RAIKES: No, we wouldn't extend that with our proposal. We're basically allowing that to expire, and then using the money instead for distance education and loan forgiveness. Okay, and I'm corrected. We're in the first year of the
